Introduction

Since childhood, I've been collecting sports memorabilia related to football – over the last 50 years, this collection has grown with a lot of passion, many wonderful encounters, countless air miles, and, of course, a considerable amount of money.

Always with the intention of opening an exhibition in 2030 for the 100th anniversary of the World Cup.

Unfortunately, in recent years I've had serious health problems with my heart, so I lack the strength to set up my planned and much-desired exhibition.

Therefore, it is with a heavy heart that I have now decided to sell my collection.

Information about the collection

The collection is only available for purchase as a whole. In total, this collection consists of approximately 500 exquisite pieces.

The collectibles from the period between 1924 and 1950 are almost exclusively secondhand, acquired from the families of the players of that era.

The unique items from Uruguay come from the collection of RONY ALMEIDA and were personally presented to me by his son, GABRIEL ALMEIDA, in Los Angeles, USA. (Photo)

(These collectibles were on loan from the Almeida family to the Football Museum in Montevideo until 2022.)

The collectibles from 1934 and 1938 come from the family estate of GIAMPIERO COMBI (goalkeeper and captain of the 1934 World Cup champions, Kingdom of Italy).

Many rarities also originate from auction houses such as AGON Sportsworld Germany, eBay, Catawiki, etc.

The authenticity of the memorabilia can be verified at any time.

Viewing the collection is possible at any time. I stand behind the authenticity and origin of the collection items to the best of my knowledge and belief.

WC Uruguay 1930





Jules Rimet Cup of PEDRO PETRONE
(May 11, 1905 – December 13, 1964)

Pedro Petrone played as a striker for the Uruguayan national team and was also part of the 1924/28 Olympic team (29 international appearances with 24 goals).



World Cup trophy for the first World Cup winners in Uruguay, 1930
donated by the Uruguayan Football Association (A U. de F.).



Gold Medale (A U. de F.) of JUAN PEREGRINO ANSELMO
(April 30, 1902 – October 27, 1975)

Juan Peregrino Anselmo was a striker for the Uruguayan national team.
At the 1930 World Cup, he played against Romania (4:0) and in the
semi-final against Yugoslavia (6:1).



Official Silver Medale of FIFA (13 Pieces) to Argentinian
EDMUNDO PIAGGIO (March 3, 1905 – July 27, 1975)

Edmundo Piaggio played in defense for the Argentine national team, but
was not playing in the 1930 final in Montevideo against Uruguay (2:4).





Cup (A U. de F.) to the captain of the Uruguay national team
JOSE NASAZZI YARZA «El Mariscal»
(May 24, 1901 – June 17, 1968)
José Nasazzi was captain at the 1924 and 1928 Olympic Games.
He played 41 international matches for Uruguay in defense.

(April 4,1902 – October 27,1975)

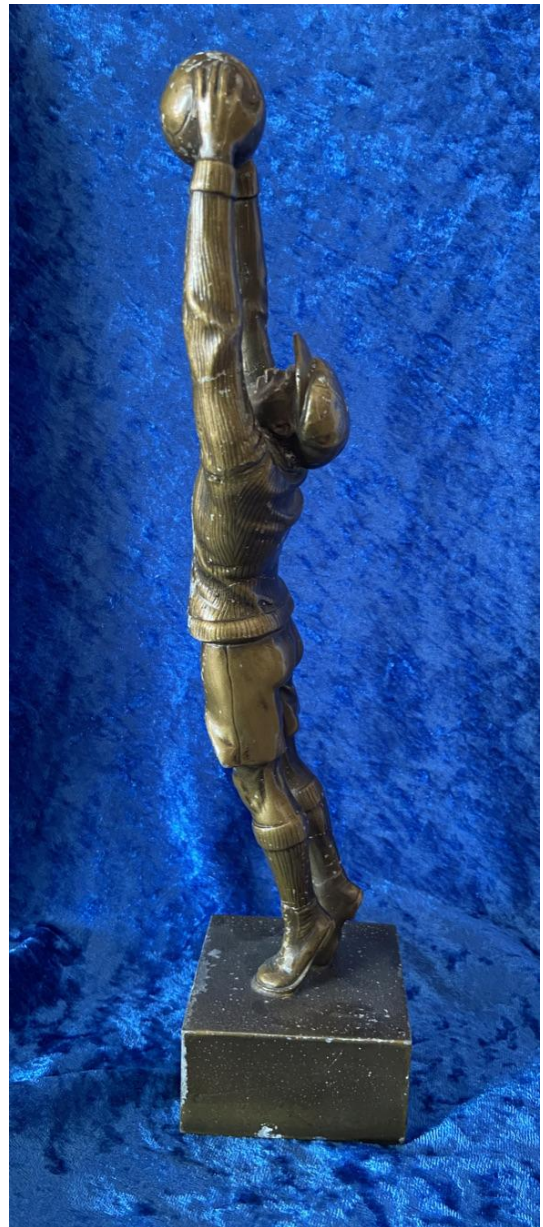


Figure from the poster for the 1930 FIFA World Cup

WC Italy 1934





Originally intended as the FIFA World Cup trophy for the 1934 World Cup winner in the Kingdom of Italy, then disapproved by Benito Mussolini. For whatever reason, it was later decided that the Jules Rimet Trophy from 1930 would be passed on as a perpetual trophy. The trophy pictured here was therefore never awarded. It is a unique piece and weights 6 kg.



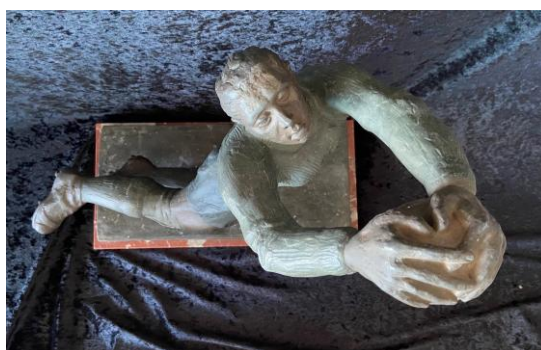

(September 29, 1913 – October 4, 1996).
Center forward for the Italian national team.
Best player of the tournament
(5 goals, including two in the quarter-final against host France (3-1)
and two goals in the final against Hungary (4-2).

WC Brasil 1950



To commemorate the 1950 World Cup in Brazil, each player on the 1930 Uruguayan national team was presented with a Jules Rimet statue. Each statue was engraved. The statue in my collection belonged to José Pedro Cea (September 1st 1900 – September 18, 1970).

José Pedro Cea is the only player to have played in every game at the 1924/1928 Olympic Games and the 1930 World Cup.



Medal of honor on wooden disc of ALCIDES GHIGGIA
(December 22, 1926 – July 16, 2015)

Alcides Ghiggia scored the decisive goal in the final against Brazil ten minutes before the end, making it 2:1 and securing the World Cup title. Alcides Ghiggia scored a goal in every match at this World Cup.

Football boots of Juan Schaffino (July 28, 1925 – November 13, 2002) scorer of the equalizer in the final against Brazil.



Signed retro shirt from ALCIDES GHIGGIA



National flag of Uruguay (170 x 85 cm), which was allegedly flown at the Maracanã Stadium in Rio de Janeiro during the final match in Brazil.



Engraved silver whistle belonging to the Italian referee GIOVANNI GALEATI (February 18, 1901 – January 7, 1959) Giovanni Galeati officiated three matches at the World Cup.

the honorary pin of Julio Perez
(June 19, 1926 – October 22, 2002).

Top Scorer Medal SANDOR KOCSIS
(September 21, 1929 – July 22, 1979) The striker for the Hungarian national team scored 11 goals and his team finished as runner-up in the World Cup behind Germany.

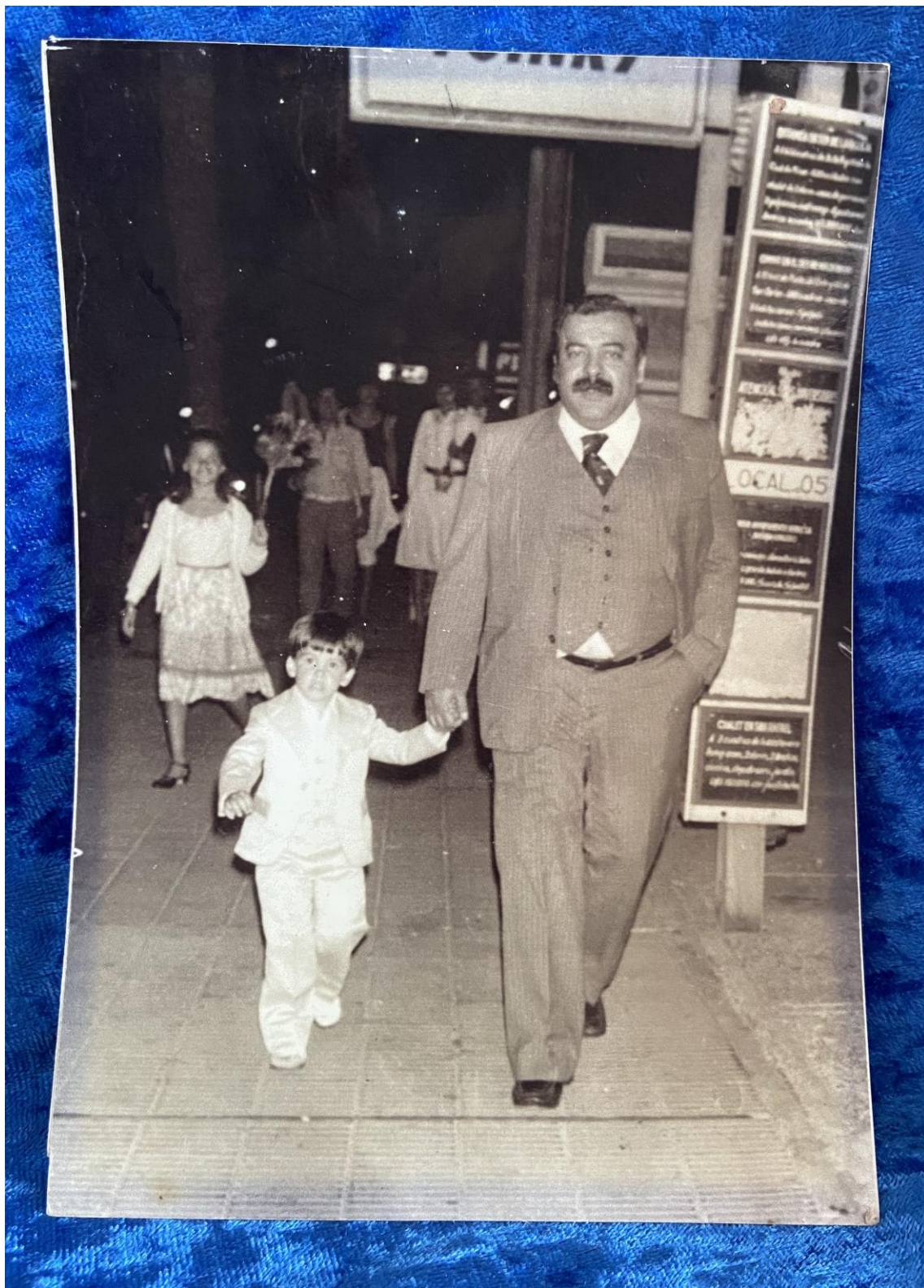

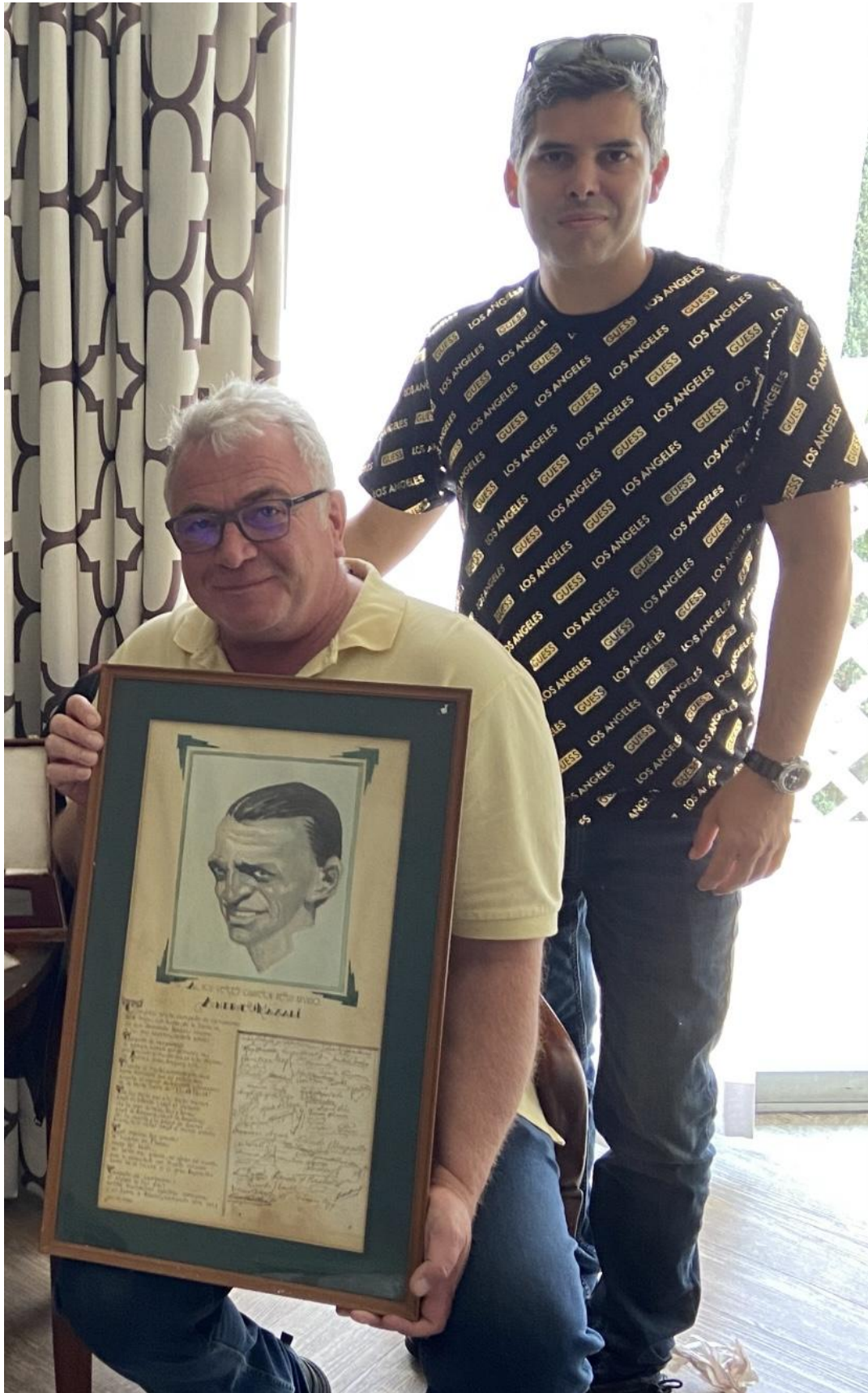
